Start / Finish:

The Youth Centre, Elstead,
Surrey (OS186 GR904435)

Located close to the A3 and about 9km west of Godalming on the B3001. Look out for a sign at the village green.

Parking: Limited parking is available opposite the hall. Otherwise, there is a car park about 1.5km further down the road (away from the centre of the village).

This is a residential area so please park considerately; do not block driveways or make excessive noise.

By train: there are stations at Guildford, Godalming and Milford, about 40, 20 & 15 minutes ride away respectively. Don't attempt to ride on the A3!

The start: the Youth Centre will be open from about 7.15. Tea, coffee, cold drinks and biscuits will be available free of charge.

The finish: drinks and a selection of tasty comestibles will be available (donations gratefully accepted).

The Routes

OS Landranger maps 185 & 186 cover the Danebury & Elstead Hundred rides and you will need sheet 184 also for the Stonehenge. Or carry the OS 'Roadmap' for SE England, which covers them all, albeit at a much smaller scale. It should be possible to follow the route from the route sheets alone, but it's always wise to carry a map.

The routes mainly follow quiet country lanes through Surrey, Hampshire and, in the case of the Stonehenge, Wiltshire. There are no big hills, but the countryside does undulate somewhat!

The Stonehenge was modified in 2005 and the new sections of route obtained the approval of all who rode last year. It remains the same this year.

The Elstead Hundred is a new route, utilizing the Stonehenge / Danebury route as far as Overton before heading directly south for New Alresford where it picks up it up again. The intervening miles are very attractive.
